In urban areas, the heat island effect is a large concern, with daytime temperatures rising 1-7 degrees Fahrenheit and nighttime temperatures rising 2-5 degrees Fahrenheit. Some creative ways of preventing this include shade structures like the ones in the attached pictures, but there are other ways of preventing it too. Trees, greenroofs, white pavement and rooftops, and water features can all alleviate the heat island effect.



Today's Presenters: ABT Drains

This week's presentation featured Reagan Rouble from ABT Drains. She discussed some of the water collection and treating products ABT Drains produces and sells. Below are some notes about what was shared:

- ABT Drains produces and sells a trench drain collection system that specializes in collecting water with chemicals and other pollutants.
- Denver International Airport utilizes ABT trench drains.
- In addition to collecting water, ABT has products that specialize in detaining and treating collected water.
- Permavoid is a plastic product that specializes in detaining contaminated water, and they can withstand heavy loads due to it being designed to be under pavement.
- ABT has done projects in London and Canada and throughout the US.
- ABT also creates tree pits that specialize in holding excess storm water which then can be stored for later use.
- Also, ABT Drains is new to the US market, arriving here 8 years ago.
